#### **Burroway Street**

Cr Dawn Collins queried the gravel area along Burroway Street. Jordan Richardson advised that there is a design to upgrade the area which will include sealing and line marking for car parking, bus zone and a dedicated heavy vehicle stop.

Cr Dawn Collins expressed concerns regarding the school bus pick up/drop off near the boulders in Burroway Street as this road is usually busy at these times and most children get off the bus and cross the road. There is a designated bus stop (for the public bus route) opposite the Police Station, on Burroway Street, this would be a preferred option. It was suggested that a letter be sent by Council to the bus operator/s requesting that the designated bus stops/shelters are used. Drivers to comply with the bus driver authority.

#### 1. PARKING SIGNAGE ALONG BURROWAY STREET, NARROMINE

**RECOMMENDED** Ewen Jones/Jason Nicholson that "No Parking" signs be placed adjacent to Ampol Service Station between the boulders and the fog line. Design is to upgrade the pavement, including line markings and then seal the area.

#### 2. SIGNAGE ALONG NYMAGEE STREET, NARROMINE HARDWARE

**RECOMMENDED** Ewen Jones/Jason Nicholson that No Parking and 90-degree Parking signs be placed outside Narromine Hardware along the kerb.

#### 3. NYMAGEE STREET PARKING ARRANGEMENT - POST OFFICE

#### 4. GIVEWAY SIGNAGE INSTALLATION - TRANGIE

**RECOMMENDED** Ewen Jones/Jason Nicholson that Give way signage be installed and line marking provided in the following streets of Trangie being Trangie Showground Road, Croudace Street, Trangie Cemetery Road and Mungery Street. VMS board to display changed traffic signage. An additional Give Way Sign Ahead (W3-2) is to be installed before the bend on the Showground Road to warn motorists of the new road changes.

#### **Executive Summary**

The purpose of this report is to discuss with the Local Traffic Committee information regarding recommendation of no parking signage where the boulders have been installed along Burroway Street.

#### Report

It has been observed since the installation of the barriers along Burroway St at the informal parking space adjacent to Ampol Service Station that vehicles are parking between the barriers and the barrier line creating a hazard to motorists.

#### **Standards**

AS1742.11:2016 – Parking Controls AS2890.5:2020 – Parking Facilities On-Street Parking

#### **Financial Impacts**

The installation is to be part of the Urban Maintenance expenditure budget.

#### **Social Impacts**

There is expected to be minimal impact as vehicles stopping create a hazard and there is an unofficial parking space adjacent if vehicles need to park.

#### **Legal Impacts**

Vehicles stopping need to be managed as per the legislative requirements associated with No Parking.

No stopping was considered however deemed no parking necessary for the site.

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


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### R5-40 (L+R)



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
REGULATORY SIGN R5-40 (L+R)



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
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

#### 2. NYMAGEE STREET PARKING ARRANGEMENT - HARDWARE

#### **Executive Summary**

The purpose of this report is to obtain comment and recommendation of signage along the footpath upgrade in Nymagee Street, Narromine outside the Hardware.

#### Report

As part of the Nymagee St Footpath Renewal Project Traffic Facility installation is required which includes Traffic Committee approval for the installation of signage for R5-505 and R5-40 signage at the attached locations.

The determination of 90-degree parking has been determined as appropriate for this site. Disability parking will be allowed for included as per standards.

#### **Standards**

AS1742.11:2016 – Parking Controls AS2890.5:2020 – Parking Facilities On-Street Parking

#### **Financial Impacts**

The installation to be part of the capital budget for expenditure from FAGS.

#### **Social Impacts**

There is expected to be minimal impacts as vehicle stops have already been installed creating an existing trend for vehicles to follow.





#### **Executive Summary**

The purpose of this report is to discuss with the Local Traffic Committee information regarding recommendation of parking arrangements at the Post Office.

#### Report

As requested by the Local Traffic Committee at the last meeting a review of the parking arrangements at the Post Office has been conducted.

The review included:

- survey work to ascertain geometrical distances.
- drawings to investigate difference options between the different parking spaces.

#### **Standards**

AS1742.11:2016 – Parking Controls AS2890.5:2020 – Parking Facilities On-Street Parking

#### **Guidelines**

Austroads Design Vehicles and Turning Path Templates Guide

#### **Financial Impacts**

The installation is to be part of the Urban Maintenance expenditure budget.

#### **Social Impacts**

Depending on the adopted angle there is expected to be some impacts associated with the changes as the area is highly trafficked.

#### **Legal Impacts**

Vehicles will be required to obey the signed traffic parking.

#### **Findings**

- The onsite car park along Nymagee Street between Dandaloo Street and Third Avenue on the North Side is not to standard nor fully defined.
- The on-street parking along Nymagee Street between Dandaloo Street and Fifth Avenue on the South Side is not standard nor fully defined correctly.
- The footpath is made up of bitumen and concrete and in very poor condition.
   Pushing car parking further west will require pedestrians to walk further on the footpath to reach the CBD.
- The road centre line is offset to the South due to the footpath median on the North being of greater width creating the conflict point for vehicles travelling along Nymagee Street.

- Existing R5-301 (1/4 HOUR PARKING) signage is superseded and does not define the angle of parking
- There is no line marking in the study area

#### Conclusion

- The design option number for installation of 45-degree parking on North and South Side of Nymagee Street between Dandaloo Street Third and Fifth Avenue will be of the greatest benefit for parking numbers and safety to motorists whilst being closest to the existing parking arrangements.
