Executive Summary

This report provides Council with an update on the levee feasibility study and feedback from community consultation recently undertaken.

Report

Council recently consulted with the Community with regards to the nominated alignment for the proposed Narromine Levee Bank Augmentation. Submissions were invited from the entire community, with the submissions closing on 17 August, 2018. Council is, however, accepting late submissions. These submissions will be presented to Council when the determination of the outcome of the feasibility study is required.

There were quite a number of submissions received in regards to the levee project. Majority of the submissions were objecting to the proposal and a summary of the basis of these objections is as follows:

- Increased depth of flooding through house/grounds;
- Property not protected by the levee;
- Unable to get insurance;
- The devaluation of properties;
- Destroying the ambience/aesthetics/tranquillity which is currently experienced;
- Noise from trucks changing gears to get over the levee;
- Potential for damage to Narromine Irrigation Board of Management infrastructure;
- Increase in rates and insurance premiums;
- Prolonged flooding;
- Damage to property;
- Burrendong Dam has been constructed, which manages flood mitigation;
- Mental stress and anguish;
- Inland Rail may further complicate and, perhaps, exacerbate flooding downstream;
- Loss of existing landscaping and established trees:
- Loss of infrastructure including fencing, structures and water and electricity lines;
- Access issues to the other side of the levee on private property;
- Destroying ecosystems and environs necessary for wildlife, echidnas in particular;
- Impacts on the northern side of the river; and
- Impacts of properties downstream of the levee.

2. LEVEE UPDATE (Cont'd)

There were some submissions in support of the proposed levee project, and alignment, and a summary of these reasons is below:

- Protect residents and community assets from flood;
- Allow for development/expansion of the area as it is currently stifled;
- Town is stagnating and future forecasts indicate further decline in population growth if nothing is done.

This is a seriously emotive issue for majority of residents along the current proposed alignment of the levee and which is evident with the majority of submissions coming from these people.

The Feasibility Study is still being finalised. When this is at hand, it will be presented to Council with the submissions in full. Council will then need to determine a course of action, which may include:

- Council determine that they move forward with the augmentation of the
 existing levee, based on the proposed alignment. In this case, further grant
 funding will need to be sought from OEH to undertake Phases E (Environmental
 Impact Statement (EIS)) and F (detailed design and documentation including
 easements etc). The next round of this funding will open in the New Year.
- Council determine that they no longer proceed with the augmentation of the Narromine levee bank and look at alternate means of offering flood protection to the town;
- Reconsider an alternate alignment which may offer flood protection to the town, while not increasing the risk of flooding to properties on Warren Road. In this case, due to no further grant funding being available for these investigations, Council will need to allocate funds from within its own budget. Preliminary estimates have been obtained for modelling of an alternate alignment, however, are subject to change with regards any additional work. These estimates will be made available at the time of determination, if required.

Financial Implications

Council has a current budget allocation in this financial year to finalise the feasibility study on a 1:6 ratio with the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH). This grant has now been finalised with no further variations accepted by OEH. Any further investigations required by Council will need to be funded by Council.

Further funding has been sought in the 2018/19 grant program for the review of the Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan that was last undertaken in 2009.

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WATER AND SEWER	
Narromine	Level 2 water restrictions continue in Narromine, in accordance with the odds and evens scheme. Staff have completed construction of the rising main from Bore 3 to the Tullamore Road Aeration Reservoir. Staff have completed mains renewal and modifications to the irrigation system on Tom Perry Drive. Contractors are continuing works on Duffy Street Reservoir rehabilitation. Staff are continuing ongoing works in relation to installation and certification of Backflow devices on Council properties. Staff have carried out pipework repairs at Narromine Pool and are setting up chemical dosing systems in readiness for pool filling to commence. Staff have carried out valve repairs and conducted network testing and reticulation pressurisation tests in preparation for spring and summer conditions. Staff have tested modifications to emergency hydraulic systems made by contractors at Narromine Waste Water Treatment Plant.



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
