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2. RECLASSIFICATION OF DANDALOO STREET TRANGIE – ENTRANCE TO THE TRANGIE TRUCK STOP

Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to obtain approval from Council to reclassify a section of Dandaloo Street, Trangie as an approved route for Common B - Double Combinations - Class 2 (25/26m B-Double) to access the Truck Stop.

Report

Prior to the commencement of the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator in February 2014, a list of approved for Common B- Double Combinations- Class 2 (26m B-Double routes) had to be gazetted routes under delegation from the NSW Roads Minister. Councils in NSW were able to add roads in their Local Government Area to the list of approved routes for the particular combination they chose.

Since the commencement of the NHVR, Councils have been required to forward their requests directly to the regulator who manages the addition and removal of any roads from the network i.e Council's request is submitted to NHVR who forwards it to RMS for action.

A review of the entrance to the Trangie Truck Stop in Dandaloo Street revealed that this section is not an approved route for Common B- Double Combinations- Class 2, and an application had to be made to Council to access the truck stop by heavy vehicle road users (Attachment No. 2)

The Trangie Truck stop was designed and constructed to accommodate Common B-Double Combinations - Class 2 and is currently being used by such vehicles. The entrance and exit is however compliant with traffic movements for such vehicles.

It has also been observed that Common Type 1 Road Trains – Class 2 (36.5m B-triples) use the truck stop from time to time.

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
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WATER AND SEWER CONT.

- Staff and contractors have completed construction and commissioning of the new deep bore 9 mechanical headworks, rising-main, electrical and telemetry infrastructure. Staff are also removing the old bore equipment and infrastructure. Contractors have commenced fencing of compound.
- The first section of the bore 8 production hole is now complete. The development of the first section confirmed the need to deepen the bore to a lower level with minimal flows being available at current bore depth i.e. max 4pl/s. A section 39a approval has been granted under the emergency provisions of the act to allow for deepening of this bore. The design for the deepened production bore has been finalised with drilling due to recommence this week.
- Staff have completed the bore pump, mechanical hydraulic installation and manifold construction at deep bore 6. The Design and Hazards operational reviews of the Iron and Manganese removal system for deep bore 6 have been completed and site works for the installation commenced by staff and contractors. The plant is due on site for installation the first week of March with the required major electrical pole and substation upgrade not possible until after 28 February due to a transformer shortage caused as a result of the bushfire damage across the state.
- Regular Drinking Water Quality sampling and analysis continues along with extra sampling involved with new bore connections and system upgrading activities.
- Sewer pump station maintenance is ongoing
- Staff have continued collection system maintenance
