The new Narromine Region Visitor Guide is now available and will be officially launched later in the year at the Narromine Aviation Museum.

In January 2018, Council relocated the Visitor Information Centre from the previous Family Day Care building to the Narromine Aviation Museum to provide a more comprehensive information service for visitors. An information stand has also been set up in the Trangie Newsagency by the Trangie Action Group to promote the region.

The Visitor Guide is recognised as a 'one stop shop' for visitors to the region featuring updated information on attractions, eateries and accommodation in Narromine, Trangie and Tomingley.

The guide also includes information on the Macquarie River and Wetlands, events and day trip opportunities.

The new visitors guide will be complimented by the updated Regional Platters Guide, Great Western Plains Guide and Boutique Shopping Map being developed over the next 3

Tourism is worth an estimated \$14M annually to our local economy, with the Narromine Region welcoming thousands of visitors per year.

Message from the Mayor



What a pleasure it is to bring you the Mayoral report for the latest quarter.

Narromine Shire Council continues to make significant progress in our endeavours to

improve all aspects of our Shire. It is such a privilege and pleasure to be able to be part of a team focussed on ensuring the best outcomes for all citizens of the shire and in the knowledge that we have such a dedicated team working towards these

Most people will have noticed the new LED board on the southern end of Dundas Park. This facility is available to all community groups to advertise their events and promotions and a call to Council offices will quickly have you organised. It is a wonderful new addition to the manner in which not only Council but all groups can get their message out to our community and to those travelling through.

The introduction of the third bin has naturally caused some concern for some of our residents and fortunately that seems to have now past in most instances. New ideas will always disrupt our habits and the decision to go ahead and introduce these bins is based on the experience many other councils have and the fact that already, the State Government is charging councils \$79 a tonne for organic waste along the east coast. Along with the majority of other inland councils, Council is pre-empting the inevitable . The outcome, as was suggested at the very beginning of this process, is that it will become a cost neutral exercise in a few years and our dependence on costly waste stations can be brought under control.

I would commend to all residents the opportunity to become a part of our online newsletter. This allows residents the automatic receipt of this document keeping them totally informed and up to the minute with all matters relating to Council.

A real highlight of the past few months has been the release of the new tourist guide. This glossy brochure highlights all the tourists hotspots in the Shire and is an excellent publication. The Economic Development team have much to be proud of with this document as it is so comprehensive in its coverage of events, accommodation, where to eat and what to do in our towns across the

Council has conducted the community consultation for the proposed levee bank augmentation toward the end of June and many of the residents potentially disrupted by this have made the effort to better acquaint themselves with the issues. This is a matter Council takes most seriously and we now seek the input of residents via submissions to outline their concerns, ideas and initiatives that may benefit Council during the deliberations that will decide if the levee goes ahead and if so, in what form. I urge all residents and not just those along the river to put their ideas forward to give Council the best options upon which to make the decisions that will have such an influential outcome to the town for many decades to come. We are determined to cause the least amount of disruption but understand perfectly our responsibility to protect all residents, their families, livelihoods and health. So please take ten minutes and jot down those ideas you have and forward to Council so they are not overlooked.

Please feel free to come along to Council meetings and observe your representatives in action.

Let's hope we see some very significant rain in the very near future to bring some much needed relief to our farmers, our Shire and all those who rely so much upon the rain.

If I'm still the Mayor I will be back again in another three months.

Waste Management

Three bin service

From July 1, residents within the Narromine Shire currently receiving a curbside collection should have received their new Food Organics and Garden Organics Bin (lime green lid). If residents have not received their

bin, please contact Council as soon as possible on 6889 9999.

What goes in the bins?

Food Organics and Garden Organics -Lime green lid

The organics bin is collected weekly and is for any kind of food scraps (meat, fruit, vegetables, etc), garden waste (lawn clippings, prunings, etc) and even shredded paper, paper towel, serviettes and old pizza boxes.

Residents are encouraged to use their Kitchen Caddy and Kitchen Caddy Liners. Council has committed to continue to provide the Caddy liners FREE to residents. If you would like another roll please contact Council.

Recycling - yellow lid

Recycling is collected fortnightly and includes steel, tin, aluminium cans, empty aerosols, clear, brown and green glass bottles and jars (no lids), plastic bottles and containers, cardboard, milk and juice cartons and newspapers, magazines and junk mail.

General Waste - red lid

General waste is collected weekly and is non-organic material such as nappies and sanitary waste and kitty litter as well as household waste such as light globes, mirrors, ceramics, cookware and drinking glasses will still go in the

2. Online Events Calendar

Our Council website, www.narromine. nsw.gov.au contains comprehensive local information and an events calendar and our tourism website www.narromineregion. com.au includes information on where to stay, eat and visit during your stay in the Region. Both websites link to the online events calendar and are a great channel for event promotion.

Event Organisers are able to independently upload their events to the website which is checked and approved by Council staff prior to going live. The listing should always include an image, short description and contact details. All events must comply with the Event Calendar Guidelines.

3. Digital LED Board

Located in the Centre of Narromine on the Mitchell Highway the board is updated by staff and promotes upcoming events, key visitor locations, weather and time updates along with community messages. The board is very popular with visitors and is a strong promotional tool. To include your event on the digital LED board you must comply with both the Event Calendar Guidelines and Digital LED Board Guidelines.

Road and footpath upgrades

The end of the financial year for roads and footpaths has seen a number of upgrades occur throughout the Shire.

Works have included the Narromine Eumungerie Road rehabilitation, Meringo St Kerb and Gutter and Derribong St Footpath Stage 1.

Eumungerie Road

Council has commenced rehabilitation and widening of the Eumungerie Road which also includes major upgrades to a culvert.

Work is scheduled to be finalised in the coming months. (works pictured below)

Meringo St Kerb and Gutter

The Meringo St Kerb and Gutter replacement has been finalised. The kerb and gutter had been destroyed by vegetation in the area over the years. Further works to the adjacent footpath and road are to commence soon.

Derribong Street Footpath

The first stage of the Derribong Street Footpath construction has been finalised. Stage one is the first of three stages which will link Manildra Street and Dandaloo

Medical Centre Upgrades



This year Narromine Shire Council has contributed over \$600,000 to upgrades at the Narromine Shire Family Health Medical Centre.

Upgrades undertaken by Council included;

- Extensions to the existing building including 3 additional consulting rooms, a pathology waiting room and an additional pathology collection room.
- Internal renovations adding an additional office space for visiting or tele-health specialists.
- New staff room and meeting spaces.

In addition to the upgrades Cotton Seed Distributors (CSD) have donated \$20,000 towards the installation of vital skin care detection equipment for the facility.

Narromine Levee Bank Augmentation

Since 1998, Council has been investigating the feasibility of upgrading the levee system protecting Narromine and responding to the lengthy requirements related to the project. In time, Council will be making the decision on whether to extend the levee or not.

This process has taken quite some time. Council undertook Community Consultation in December, 2013. After receiving feedback, Council has since undertaken various internal reviews, an independent Peer Review and clarified quite a number of issues.

The proposed alignment was determined, by Council, in April, 2018. A copy of this alignment is below for your information.

The next step is further community consultation, which has included individual consultation with residents directly impacted as a result of a levee being put into place along with an Information

Forum held at the Narromine USMC on Wednesday 27 June 2018.

Council is inviting all residents to have their say in regards to the Narromine Levee Bank Augmentation.
