Executive Summary

This report is presented to Council to determine a nominal lease fee for the sub-lease of the turntable and surrounding area at Narromine.

Report

Council has leased the turntable and surrounding area from ARTC for beautification purposes since 1996. The total area leased is approximately 860m2. The lease allows Council to sub-let to local non-profit community groups. In April 1997, Council sub-leased the area to the Narromine Lions Club Incorporated for a period of 12 months and at a nominal rental of \$1.00 payable on demand, whereby the sub-lessee was to erect fencing and secure the turntable.

Recently the Narromine Lions Club contacted Council to support their application for funding for repair work to the truck and S track etc. Partial sponsorship has now been awarded to the applicant, therefore works can commence in due course.

The Narromine Lions Club have also requested permission to undertake minor landscaping work, which incorporates water-wise vegetation, surrounding the turntable.

It would therefore be in Council's best interest to enter into a short-term sub-lease with the Narromine Lions Club Incorporated to determine responsibilities for each party.

Financial Implications

Council currently pays \$482.59 per annum to lease the area.

Legal and Regulatory Compliance

Lease between ARTC and Council for the purposes of beautification.

Risk Management Issues

The lease between ARTC and Council allows for sub-lease to a local non-profit community group.

A sub-lease for beautification works between Council and the Narromine Lions Club Incorporated will provide certainty of responsibilities between the parties.

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2. NARROMINE LIONS CLUB - TURNTABLE CONT.

Given that the Narromine Lions Club Incorporated is not for profit and will be undertaking the beautification works on behalf of Council, it is proposed that the sublease fee be \$1.00 per annum payable on demand.

Trangie	 Staff have continued reticulation system maintenance. Staff continue to deal with sewer pump station blockages and mains chokes due to non-biodegradable materials being used in the sewer systems. Contractors and staff have completed installation, testing, commissioning and proving of the replacement switchboard and control equipment in the upgrade plan for Trangie Sewage Treatment Plant. The results have been good with a better level of control and adjustment now possible. 	
Narromine	 Contractors have continued construction of the Iron and Manganese removal plant at the town bore 6 site. Dry Commissioning has been completed with some instrumentation issues necessitating instrument recalibrations. Wet commissioning took place on 3 June and will be immediately followed by process proving and reliability testing, which will run for around 5 weeks. Staff have completed mains replacement in Meryula Street between Meringo and Culling Streets. Staff have also completed mains replacement in Temoin Street between Nymagee and Meringo Streets. Various defective stop valves have been replaced on the northern side of Narromine to better facilitate isolation and decrease service outage when conducting mains replacement and repairs. Road surfaces will be restored once a sealing contractor has been appointed. Regular Drinking Water Quality sampling and analysis continues, along with extra sampling involved with new bore connections and system upgrading activities. Sewer pump station maintenance is ongoing and has increased in frequency due to problems with non-biodegradable materials being used by consumers as a substitute for toilet paper. Staff have continued sewer collection system maintenance with an increase in blockage frequency being noted.
