The Chair invited general business from the Group;

- **Narromine Residential Strategy** Council has endorsed, 70 housing blocks are soon to come on the market. The levee development will encourage another 100 blocks once completed. The Flood Levee alignment has been endorsed by Council.
- **Dappo Road Development** Tender is imminent, subdivision soon to be approved.
- **Development Applications** \$5.7M in 2015, \$17.8M in 2021.
- **Tomingley** 2 x Roadhouses DA approved.
- **Trangie** \$2.5M Funding for Trangie LALC Aged Care housing.
- **Feedlot** Large firm continuing to complete due diligence on land in the Narromine Shire with plans to establish a 50,000 hd feedlot.
- **Aerodrome** Hangar Development soon to commence with two custom built hangars being erected in the Aviation Business Park.
- **Freight Exchange** \$9M of State funding has been received for the enabling infrastructure works.
- Main Street Activation and Revitalisation \$1M of funding through the Murray Darling Basin Economic Development Round 3 has been applied for, awaiting confirmation of funding.
- \$2.4M Resources for Regions Funding towards Cale Oval and Tennis Courts.
- \$3M Roads Funding for local roads improvements.

- **Korean Consortium** keen to develop technology in the Narromine Shire, based at the Aviation Business Park.
- **Inland Rail** continues to progress. It is anticipated that the project will required a significant local workforce for three to four years.
- **Tomingley Gold Mine** has an approved DA to extend the mine life. New application to expand operations. The expansion will include the redirection of the Newell Highway 6km. Increased activity and extension of the mine will put increased demand for housing and labour.
- **Connectivity** connectivity issues are being experienced across the region, poor latency with satellite, network congestion and internet service providers not providing enough bandwidth in peak usage periods.
- **Dolly Parton Festival -** October 2022.
- Narromine Hospital masterplan for the future, local GP's not working from the hospital. EDG to propose a meeting re standard of health services in the Shire. Country Mayors Association have requested a Minister for Regional Health be appointed. Resourcing concerns raised regarding the ambulance service.
- **Newcastle to Narromine Rail link** O2N Research/attracting new business to the region.
- **Dubbo to Narromine Highway Upgrades** The NSW Government has committed over \$30M to deliver a number of projects along the 36km section of the Mitchell Highway between Dubbo and Narromine, providing safe and efficient travel for a variety of vehicle types.
- Macquarie River Re-regulating Storage (Gin Gin Weir) Development Council have been working on upgrading the entry and road into the weir.
- **Economic Development Strategy** to be reviewed and updated.

Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to obtain comment and endorsement on the proposed temporary road closure for a section of Sissian Road, Trangie

Report

Council has received a request from Robinson Grain Trading Co to undertake the temporary road closure of a section of the Sissian Road and road reserve at the property boundary of Lot 41 DP 1176676 (approximately 1,500m in length) Attachment 1.

The section in question is currently utilised by the proponent and the land occupancy within the Road Reserve has been in operation by the land holder of the time since prior to 2011.

Sissian Road is currently classed a hierarchy 6 in Council's Asset Management Plan (unformed road) and is not maintained by Council.

No other road users will be impacted upon as a result of this closure.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That the Traffic Committee considers and endorses the temporary road closure;
- 2. Relevant stakeholders are notified by public consultation and other required processes; and
- 3. The proponent enters into an agreement with Council as the Roads Authority regarding the use of the Road Reserve.

Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to obtain comment and endorsement on proposed temporary road closures for various unformed unsealed roads in Trangie by providing appropriate barricades.

2. TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES - VARIOUS ROADS IN TRANGIE (Cont'd)

Report

A number of unformed roads exist in Trangie which are currently classed as Hierarchy 6 in Council's Asset Management Plans. **Attachment 2**. These roads are currently not maintained. At this stage, the unformed roads are being used by road users during or after rain events. This causes considerable damage to our road infrastructure due to the anti-social behaviour. It further creates a hazard since some of these unformed roads are located adjacent to an unfenced open drain, which road users access regularly.

The current drainage systems to be upgraded in future will be serviced with an interim service road. It will then be ultimately accessed by the public, once vacant lots have been developed.

Access to existing dwellings will still be maintained as per Council policy. It should be noted that roads will be opened to the public, once the lot(s) have been developed and access to the lots are required.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That the Traffic Committee considers and endorses the temporary road closure;
- 2. Relevant stakeholders are notified by public consultation and other required processes; and
- 3. Council proceed with the erection of required barricades to prevent the public from accessing these roads.

Report

As part of the Development Application and relevant approval processes, the proponent has submitted design drawings (provided to the committee under separate cover), pertaining to traffic facilities (lines and signage) for consideration and endorsement by the Local Traffic Committee. These drawings were previously distributed to the Committee for comment. The recommendation from the Committee was to distribute updated drawings to the Committee for discussion out of session (RECOMMENDED Cr Collins/David Vant that the report be noted and further advice and information to be circulated to the committee members out of session). Confirmation was obtained that the current truck stop entrance and exit will remain unchanged. After recent discussions with TfNSW, it was suggested to discuss this application at the Committee.

Concerns have been raised regarding traffic movements especially from heavy vehicles entering the Tomingley Truck Stop from the rear of Genanagie Street. Therefore, it is suggested that an additional supplementary plate (r9-223) is installed below the "No- entry Signs". Please refer to the example below:



This will allow vehicles such as a garbage truck or other service vehicles less than 12.5m in length to enter Genanagie Street from this location.

While the complete drawing package has been provided to the Committee (under separate cover) to explain the context of the development and traffic movements, endorsement is sought particularly for the following drawings:

- b) C302 Issue A


