3. PHILIPPINE AMBASSADOR

As I have previously reported to Council, I was fortunate to be able to meet with the Ambassador for The Philippines in Canberra on 21st June 2022. Our discussion largely centered on the potential of an immigration program that could see a gradual influx of both skilled and unskilled workers from the Philippines into our Shire.

The industry is facing a labor shortage of unprecedented proportions in the coming years and to ensure we make the best of the opportunities that will arise we need to prepare to bring workers from a number of areas. The Philippine people have an enviable reputation for their skills and work ethic. They assimilate extremely well and can become a dynamic and essential part of our community.

With the concurrence of Council, I am proposing that following an informal invitation to the Ambassador during my visit, we can now move to a formal invitation for her to come to our Shire. Her visit would include a Civic reception one evening and a tour of some of the likely places of employment. The reception would include Federal Politicians, State Politicians, Councillors, some staff and potential employers who could offer the entourage insights into the work available now and into the future. Her Excellency Hellen De La Vega did indicate to me that she would likely include her Labor Attaché as well as her Consul General.

Should Council agree to support this proposal, a further Mayoral Minute will be presented to Council with a proposed agenda and indicative cost for endorsement.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council agrees in principle to extend a formal invitation to Ambassador Hellen De La Vega, with a further Mayoral Minute presented to Council providing the agenda and estimated cost for Council's endorsement.
