

COUNCIL COLUMN – WEDNESDAY 27 JANUARY 2021

Please be advised that there is no Ordinary Council meeting held in January. The next Ordinary Council meeting will be held Wednesday, 10 February 2021 at Council's Chambers, commencing at 5.30 pm. Following the lifting of the COVID-19 Restrictions, Council has resumed meeting in the Chambers with a maximum of TEN (10) members of the public in attendance. The meetings will no longer be live streamed; however, an audio recording will be uploaded the following day.

DOMESTIC NOISE POLLUTION

Narromine Shire Council is reminding all residents about domestic noise pollution. EXTENDED SCHOOL HOLIDAY HOURS AT NARROMINE AND TRANGIE AQUATIC CENTRES

Narromine and Trangie Aquatic Centres will have extended pool hours during the 2020/2021 Summer school holiday period effective from 21 December 2020 through to 29 January 2021.

Entry fees to both Narromine and Trangie Aquatic Centres will be **half price** from Saturday **16 January** through to Thursday **4 February 2021**. Entry fees are subsidised by NSW Government and apply only to a daily admission fee, non-swimming admission fee and swimming carnival spectator fee.

MAJOR PROJECTS

Council would like to advise of the following major projects that are currently on public exhibition:

Inland Rail - Narromine to Narrabri proposed by Australian Rail Track Corporation Limited. The Proponent has requested the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces to declare the proposal as critical State Significant Infrastructure.

This section of the Inland Rail project consists of approximately 300 km of new single-track rail line, through private and public property in a "greenfield" environment between Narromine and Narrabri.

The State Significant Infrastructure (SSI) application, Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and accompanying documents are on exhibition until **Sunday 7 February 2021** and are accessible electronically on the Department's website www.planningportal.nsw.gov.au/major-projects/project/10211

Tomingley Gold (Alkane Resources Ltd) have submitted a Modification Report and Appendices for Tomingley Gold MOD 5. The Department of Planning, Industry and Environment is aiming to have the Modification on exhibition **Wednesday 16 December 2020 to Friday 29 January 2021**.

Council will hold a hard copy of the application for the exhibition period and it will also be available on the Department's website.
